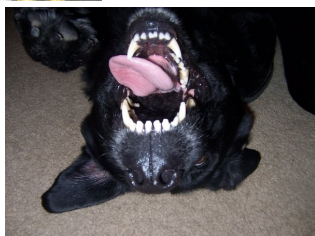
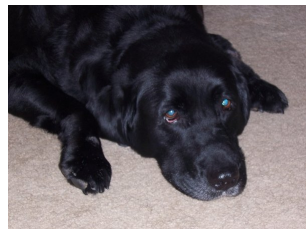
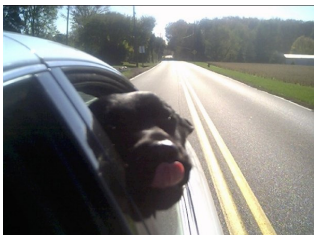
CCO Loses a Canine Family Member

R.I.P. Hunter...you are missed.

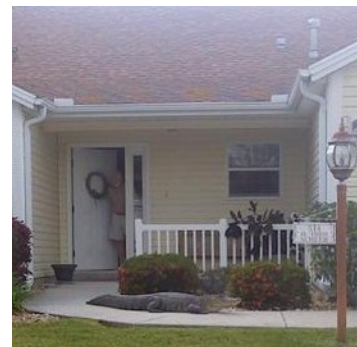


Reptiles in the News

Animal Handling Training for Police and Fire Departments

Cool Critters Outreach has developed a training for our men in uniform. With more people getting exotic pets the need to handle them is becoming more prevalent.

More often the police and fire departments are coming into contact with individuals who house these animals. Some have them as pets, others use them as guards against their illegal narcotics.

We can now assist them in learning how to properly handle large pythons, alligators, lizards and more in the instance they encounter one of these animals.

Training is a hands-on process using non-venomous reptiles and lasts approximately 1 hour, depending on the size of the class.
